## Let's Get Crafty




### What you need:

- Small cardboard tube (craft or toilet paper roll)
- Colored construction paper
- Coloring markers or crayons
- Scissors
- Clear tape and/or glue stick
- Ribbon (2-3")
- Googly eyes (2)



### What you do:

1. Print out the template\*.
2. Color the template pieces whatever chameleon colors you like—look at some chameleon photos for inspiration!
3. Cut out the pieces on the template.
4. Wrap tube with construction paper (use any color you like).
5. Find the circle shaped piece. Tape or glue it to the back of tube to cover the opening.
6. Find the piece with the four legs. Tape or glue the legs section to the bottom of the tube.
7. Glue the googly eyes to your chameleon's head and draw on the smile.
8. Fold the head at the fold line. Connect the top of the head together and glue to the top of the tube.
9. Find the chameleon's crest. Fold it and then glue to top of the tube.
10. Time to make the tongue! You might need an adult's help to use scissors to curl the ribbon, then glue to the mouth.





Cut out template pieces.  
Dotted lines show  
where to fold.




If swirl too hard to cut

and color in tail




## Chameleon Craft Instructions


Attach tube  
to feet and tail.  
(Will be flat  
on the surface  
under tube)



Attach circle to  
back of tube




Attach Head  
Fold at nose tape  
along sides to  
connect to tube




Tape 2 parts at top of  
head together

Feet and Tail  
will lie flat


Fold crest in middle



Cut out arch




Fold bottom flaps and  
attach to top of tube




Glue googly eyes and  
add smile and nose


Attach ribbon to  
mouth area


## Follow the Steps

## Mask Task



### What you need:


- Printing paper
- Card stock or construction paper
- Crayons or Markers
- Glue Stick
- Scissors
- String or shoelaces
- Party blow horn

### What you do:

- Use template on next page to print mask
- Glue printed mask on to thin cardboard or construction paper to make it more durable
- Color/decorate your mask
- Cut out mask, eyes, mouth, side holes (follow dotted lines)
- Put string through small side holes
- Put mask on face and use strings to tie behind your head
- Blow party horn so it stretches out. Party horn is like chameleon tongue shooting out to catch a bug!
